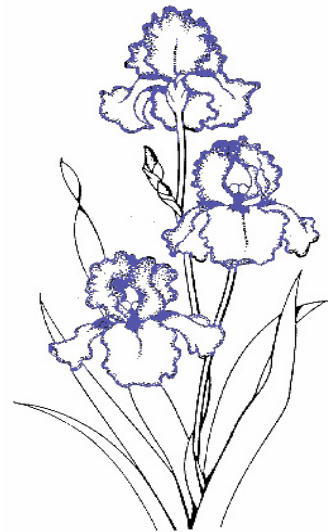

M.D. Faith Youth Achievement Award

A Youth Achievement Certificate will be awarded annually at the Region 22 Annual meeting in August, along with a check in the amount of \$50.00. The recipient shall be the Region 22 nomination for the AIS Clarke Cosgrove Award. The purpose of this award is to publicly recognize and encourage a youth member of Region 22 for outstanding achievements in the culture of irises, participation in local, regional and national iris organizations and promotion of these organizations. To be eligible for this award, nominees shall be an AIS Youth member under 19 years old residing in Region 22 and have demonstrated some of the following achievements:

- Growing an excellent, well maintained iris garden;
- Actively hybridizing irises;
- Writing articles for an iris publication;
- Helping an iris organization through a committee, activity, or by holding an office;
- Visiting local iris gardens at bloom time;
- Attending regional-national/ conventions;
- Studying to be an AIS judge;
- Promoting irises and/or the AIS to others;
- Signing up new AIS memberships;
- Competing at shows;
- Experimenting with irises;
- Showing an interest in the various iris classes and sections;
- Demonstrating leadership skills.

Nominations may be made by the committee, Region 22 Youth Chairperson, by an iris society/club, or any 3 members in Region 22. The Region 22 Youth Achievement Award committee will be composed of the RVP, the current Youth Chairperson, and one member-at-large, as needed from the states of Arkansas and Oklahoma. You must make your nomination in writing to the RVP for Region 22 or a committee member no later than March 31, 2011.

Iris Doctor

If you are looking for other iris for your garden, try *iris tridentata*. Information available is brief, containing slight cultural information. Mostly, they are confined to growing in the area of native habitat and occurrence, which is in the southeastern portion of the United States, the states of North and South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, and Tennessee.

A member of the beardless iris species, native to the southern areas, it is hardy and should grow well in both Arkansas and Oklahoma. My own personal experience growing this iris in Arkansas, and trying to identify this species, confirms this.

By a fortunate accident, I acquired a small piece of a rhizome in the spring of 1993 at a regular meeting of the Central Arkansas Iris Society. The plant was given as a door prize to a friend of mine. Seeing my eyes light up at this unusual iris plant, my friend insisted that she share it with me. I went immediately to the donor questioning him about the iris. He collected the iris in a swamp near Waycross, Georgia, and it required being grown in water.

With little information, I grew it in a gallon container, placed in a container of water. It grew slowly that year. Concerned about hardness, I placed it in a south-facing garage window to prevent freezing. In the spring, I repotted to a two-gallon container. Feeding monthly with 15-30-15 Miracle Grow, keeping it wet and in a pan of water at all times. It went back into the garage for the second winter. Next spring. I repotted to a 22 inches diameter plastic tub, 15 inches deep with no drain holes. Feeding regularly, I kept water covering the surface of the soil.

I was disappointed that it had not bloomed, and began to wonder if it would ever bloom. Then after the Tall Bearded and Louisiana iris had bloomed, and near the tail end of the Japanese iris bloom, it started throwing up quite a few flower stalks.

Iris Doctor (cont'd)

The stalks were about 22 to 28 inches tall, most had one branch, and now I think some had two branches. Slender and graceful, the stalks had two buds on the terminal position, as well as on most of the branches. Patience has its reward!

When the first blooms opened, the blue-purple falls with deeper veining flared open, revealing a white patch at the hafts infused with golden yellow. These were crowned with blue style arms with serrated crests, which curled up, and were about three-quarter inch long - a beautiful iris, but with no discernible standards. Identified later, the iris was the species *iris tridentata*.

Due to the heaviness of the tub, I decided to take a chance on it being hardy enough to stand our winters here in north central Arkansas. It has since been situated half buried on a steep slope with the south side of the tub exposed to the elements. Feeding it with liquid 15-30-15 on a regular basis, and supplying water with a hand held hose periodically, it has thrived, crawling out of the tub and rooting itself on the bank above the tub. It has with stood temperatures of 15(F) degrees or colder on several occasions during our last three winters.

In 1999, I sent two rhizomes of this clone to Cincinnati, Ohio, where temperatures went to 0 (F) that winter. I received a report that they put up fans in late April of 2000. It appears it is cold hardy in that area, at least with some winter protection.

Iris tridentata is a good garden iris and should be more widely grown. It certainly is not as demanding of special attention as I was first led to believe. It would certainly be a pleasant addition to any garden.
